Minutes of Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 14th November 2022 at 7.30 pm in the Recreation Ground Pavilion

1. **APOLOGIES:** Councillor S. Mowles, Mr R Brunt (Tree Warden), R Kerry (DC).

2. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

The minutes of the meeting held on 3rd October 2022 having been previously circulated were taken as read, approved and signed.

3. **DECLARATION OF INTERESTS**

Councillor Cade recorded an interest in item 7 Finance vii) Eastern Angles production.

4. **PUBLIC OPEN FORUM**

<u>Police Report</u> None received; recommendation of PCC of Rachel Keaton as Cheif Constable noted.

<u>Parishioners Questions</u> Vice-chairman of KAFPA gave an outline of the group's association and financial commitments over the years with Eastern Angles productions. Financial losses had occurred on occasions which the group had managed to sustain, but wasb not a situation that could be allowed to continue. He recalled that in the past the Parish Council had in the past to undertaken to underwrite any such losses, making an appeal if such a commitment could be resumed in the future. Following questions from the Councillor the Chairman thanked him for his contribution and confirmed it would be considered later during the PC meeting.

County Councillor's Report Mrs Mulachay's monthly report had been circulated and highlighted the contract let fro the refurbishment of Foxhall recycling centre programmed for completion in 1924 and the financial pressures the CC will be facing due to the economic situation; it sought feedback from the community and businesses through a web site survey. The Warm Homes initiative was emphasised. A question was put to her about the condition of the footway along Trimley/Kirton Roads past the school, particularly when the school is moved. She offered to make enquiries of SCC Highways. The Council would arrange to discuss this at a future meeting, .

District Councillor's Report The District Councillors had submitted reports and following representations from Councillors efforts will be made to emphasise local news. Funding available to ease household pressures was promoted and developments in Felixstowe and Woodbridge were noted.

<u>PTLO Report</u> Mr Hatrick had nothing new to report, though chang3s next month were anticipated. The Clerk would endeavour to submit a response to the Rural Mobility survey circulated by SCC.

<u>Tree Warden Repor</u> (attached). Suggested the references to the Burnt House Lane oak tree could be passed to the County Councillor to follow up.

5. MATTERS ARISING

- i) <u>Rectory Lane fingerpost</u> The County Councillor will expedite with design team (221096). The Council will arrange to make payment for the works.
- ii) <u>Christmas tree lighting</u> Arrangements were finalised. Councillor Jacobs together with Pauls would shortly erect the new lights. Councillor Lickert agreed to co-ordinate the event, Jean Walker will accompany the carol singing, G Walker would provide mulled wine; the White Horse supplying mince pies. Stephan Harvey to be approached to do the usual tree dedication and arrange school children's contribution. Agreed Charity Collection would go to St John's Parish Pantry in Felixstowe.
- iii) <u>Speeding signage</u> A report on the condition of 30 mph signage through the villages prepared by Councillor Licket had been submitted to SCC and a Problem Report 00376430 had been logged. (22186). No response had been received to date. Suggested County Councillor be asked to follow up.

- vi) Ease the Sqeeze A grant tof £2340 through the Government's Warm Rooms initiative (2211/15/3170) had been secured for the White Horse to provide facilities on 2 days a week, 6 hrs a day, for 18 weeks beginning at the end of November 2022.
- vi) <u>Back Road junction</u> Cerk had written to headteacher but had received no response.
- vii) Trimley interchange No update to report.

- i) <u>Felixstowe Community Partnership</u> Councillor Colvill advised that a meeting should be scheduled soon.
- ii) East Suffolk Services Establishment of new ESC Services (221109) noted.

7. **FINANCE**

- i) <u>Finance/Monitoring reports</u> (attached) The RFO presented accounts to the 9th November having been verified by Councillor Jacobs and signed by the Chairman.
- ii) <u>Salaries/Precept</u> The RFO explained that following the National agreement on Local Government salaries, subsequent to the last meeting (221213/39), those for the Clerk and RFO have had to be raised; proposed J Shaw, seconded J Durrant and carried that the precept request should be raised to £24,854.

- iii) <u>Finger post grants</u> Grants towards the cost of the finger posts had been approved from both ESC and SCC.
- iv) <u>Quiet Lanes</u> Advice from SCC on parish contributions recieived (221134): Kirton & Falkenham Have yet to be assessed.
- v) <u>VG Christmas tree</u> Proposed I Cade, seconded J Shaw and carried that the quotation from Pauls Tree Services to trim the tree in the sum of £360 be accepted
- vi) <u>Eastern Angles</u> In reference to the earlier appeal,(221147), proposed D Jacobs, seconded J Shaw and carried that the Council would on an annual basis on application agree a guarantee not exceeding £250 to KAFPA to coverany losses incurred in supporting Eastern Angles productions in Kirton. Agreed such an arrangement fulfils commitments to Community Activities.

The Council confirmed irs previous view that access did not present a problem. Clerk to reply.
- ii) <u>Back Road dog bin</u> The Clerk apprised the councillors of correspondence with Trimley St Martin PC on the dog bin at Back Road/Hamms Lane. Having accepted that it is in Kirton as K & F PC had asked for it, it does

stand in TSM. Agreed TSM request for a litter bin at this location is not for K & F PC to provide.

ii) "Pardon the Weeds" An initiative trialled in Felixstowe in limiting cutting of grass areas to encourage wild flowers, had been introduced by ESC inviting councils to participate.. Noted; such ideas had been put forward to the Council with regard to the Village Green
